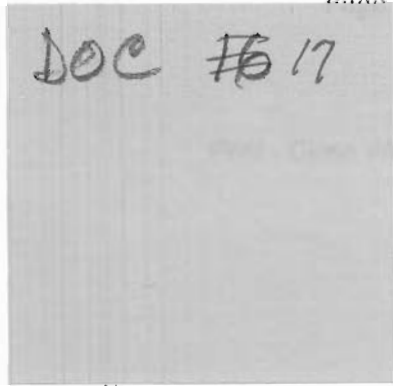

I need some guidance regarding the request for a no-cost time extension for the *Phlox pilosa* research and development grant #R-004-05.

Do you want me to conclude the report on time and ask for a time extension to complete the planting in a cover letter to the committee? or in the report itself?

Do I ask for a six month time extension and turn in the report at the end of the extension? (I am prepared to complete it on time.)

Could I offer a no-cost extension to the production phase (two more years) to support the market availability of *pilosa* past the grant term in lieu of completing the planting specified in the grant?

I ask this for two reasons. In accepting the substitution of another species for the original proposal and not having immediate access to plant material for the substituted specie I got far behind in production and site parameters of the original grant did not lend itself to the new specie.

The second reason is that I have submitted several proposals for the next grant cycle and I want to proceed with keeping in good standing for the new proposals. Thank you for your input and direction. ~Joanna Booth
