The Salter Tree and Herb Farm is announcing the addition of Phlox nivalis, Trailing Phlox, to the production inventory. Orders will be taken on a contract basis to provide rooted cuttings of this sandhill, sun-loving plant. Nivalis will grow in the high shade, of pines, turkey oaks and red oaks. It will tolerate poor sandy soil and will adjust to full sun as well. Regular watering will help, wet soil will not.

The propagation colony was established through a grant from the Florida Wildflower Foundation. Source material is Florida native wildflowers from Pasco, Calhoun, and Columbia counties.
