The Salter Tree and Herb farm received and research and development grant to find, collect, and propagate the Florida wildflower Phlox *nivalis* or trailing phlox. This plant is difficult to find: it grows in sandhills with longleaf pine and turkey oak. It is seldom seen with more than two or three plants together. In central Florida it may bloom Jan-Mar depending on the season. While herbarium site data exists, nothing shows data less than 10 years old - most 30 to 50 years old. Please circulate this request for assistance among your associates via e-mail, newsletters or other means.
